 - ATTENDEES # 35-59, MAJORITY FEMALES EACH YEAR
 - ALINE, ALVA, CANTON, CHEROKEE, CLEO SPRINGS, FAIRVIEW, AND WAYNOKA SCHOOLS REPRESENTED
 - MAJORITY ENJOYED THEIR TIME AT CAMP (65% OR 95%)
 - 75%-96% FELT THEY LEARNED VALUABLE INFORMATION ABOUT MEDICAL CAREERS AT CAMP
 - THE ONE CHANGE REQUESTED MOSTLY IS TO MAKE THE CAMP LONGER! 
 - REPORTED THAT THEY LEARNED ABOUT THEMSELVES THROUGH THE EXPERIENCE AND THEIR FUTURE AND PLANS WERE CHANGED FOR THE BETTER DUE TO ATTEND CAMP

- 2021
 - 7 STUDENTS; 3 MALE AND 4 FEMALES
 - ALVA, FREEDOM, WAYNOKA
- 2022
 - 2 WERE TO ATTEND BUT HAD TO CANCEL
 - NO ATTENDEES DUE TO COVID YEAR (2020 when eligible for MASH I) and SCHEDULE OF CAMPS
- 2023 PLANS-RETURN TO JOB SHADOWING EXPERIENCES AND INCREASE PARTICIPATION

SUCCESS OF M*A*S*H*

▪ Parent University

- STUDENTS AND PARENTS REPORTED A DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF DEGREE PLANNING AND FINANCIAL AID. RESULTS SHOWED THAT STUDENTS WERE ENROLLING AT A HIGHER LEVEL IN THE PROGRAMS AT NW TECH AND HAD PLANS TO ENROLL AT NWOSU.

- IN 2021 4 SCHOLARSHIPS WERE GIVEN TO 2 STUDENT ATTENDING NW TECH AND 2 ATTENDING NWOSU
 - NURSING
 - PRE-MED
 - PSYCHOLOGY
- SCHOLARSHIPS WERE AWARDED AGAIN IN 2022, ENROLLMENT SEEN AT NW TECH AND AT NWOSU FOR SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS FOR EACH AWARDEE.
